- Bob Irvin gave an update from the National Forest Homeowners convention in Seattle last April and spoke on the present state of the CUFFA (Cabin Fee Fairness Act) reform. The Cabin Coalition II/NFH are still trying to get a congressional hearing on CUFFA reform and have some solutions to offer. - The membership voted by majority to donate \$5,000 to the NFH for the CUFFA reform coalition to help fight for fair fees for our cabins. I want to personally thank the membership for this donation; it could not have come at a better time and for a more important cause that affects all of us.

- The Board agreed to form a committee to study the pros & cons of having historical designation for our cabins; we will keep you updated.

GOT MRFHA?

The need for civic action within the Metolius Basin has become evident. We now are engaged with mounting concerns centered on the Cabin User Fee Fairness Act (CUFFA). We wish to summon the involvement of cabin users, especially of the younger generations, to become aware of the issues that we face in successfully securing our precious residences along the Metolius River.

Declaration of Involvement for all Cabin Users

When in the Course of human events it becomes necessary for one people to unite under a common connection to our Metolius River, a respect for preservation will impel them to act with a sense of civic involvement.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all cabin users are created equal, that they are endowed with certain alienable Rights, limited by the powers of the Federal Government and the United States Forest Service. To secure and maintain our permits, it is the Right of the Permit Holders and Cabin Users to become connected to the Metolius River Forest Homeowners Association (MRFHA), as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Prudence, Security and Longevity of cabin use. All experience hath shewn that wo/mankind are more disposed to success pursuing civic concern, knowledge and stewardship for the love of the Metolius Basin. Customarily, we call all cabin users to join MRFHA, it is their right, it is their duty, to provide new Guards for the future security of recreational cabin use along this beloved river.

METOLIUS PROTECTION ACT – HB 3298

The Metolius Protection Act of 2009 passes the Oregon House by a margin of 31-28! The Bill extends unprecedented state protection to the Metolius Basin and its watershed by creating the state's first-ever Area of Critical Statewide Concern (ACSC). Under the ACSC classification commercial development within the Basin is firmly restricted. HB 3298 was signed into law on July 15th on the bridge over-looking Wizard Falls. Several key legislators accompanied Governor Kulongoski, such as: Betsey Johnson, Ginny Burdick (both with family residences within the Basin), Brian Clem and Peter Courtney. The Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs, Eric Kancler of the Central Oregon Landwatch and roughly 100 civic activists were present to witness the signing of this historic legislation. Thanks to everyone who wrote letters, made calls and did their part to help make the success of this Bill a reality!

WATER TESTING

Water testing KITS will be available for the Labor Day weekend Sep. 5-7, and may be picked up at the annual picnic or at Tract 0 lot 23. The cost of the combined nitrate and bacteria test will be \$55, payable to UMPQUA Research Company.

Please bring your completed tests to cabin 0-23 anytime between 1:30pm Monday Sep. 7 and 8:30 am Tuesday Sep. 8th. Place them in the cooler at the end of the driveway.

Do not fill your bottle before Monday at 1:00pm to make sure your test is valid. You do not have to send your report to the Forest Service: MRFHA will get copies of the reports and submit them for you. Thanks for your participation, the discount we receive for doing it as a group helps us all.

FIRE SEASON 2009

The Black Butte II fire is contained. Dark clouds in the sky over the river indicate we are in the middle of fire season. SUGGEST we all pick up the pine needles, cones and blow off the roof. We are required to keep our lots free of debris for thirty feet around our cabins as a fire barrier. The next available date for lawn debris to be taken to the dump is October 10. Directions are to proceed toward Hwy 20 on our RD 14. Slow down and look for a marked point of entry on the left, just prior to the curve in road.

TRACT ROAD DUST ABATEMENT 2010

Cabin owners have an opportunity to have their tract roads treated to reduce dust next year. Road District 18 has insufficient funds, thus cabin owners will have to foot the bill. To make this work each cabin is assessed according to the grid below. Though this is an optional program a minimum number of cabins in a given tract MUST participate to reach a threshold, else work the roads will not be treated and funds will be returned. Calculations are based on a 70% participation rate. Should any tract exceed the threshold there *may* be a refund of excess collected.

Tract Road	Min # Cabin	Cost/Cabin
Tract C	31	\$125/each
Tract H	10	\$115/each
Tract I	7	\$ 85/each
Tract O	22	\$125/each

MRFHA MEMBERSHIP, UNRAVELLED

The Association By-Laws provide that a Regular Member shall be a dues paying cabin permit holder, and have full voting rights. Further, the By-Laws provide that the Board may decide by majority to admit Associate members who agree to pay dues. It has been the boards' practice to approve all qualified Associate members, without exception. The Board may elect to institute OTHER classes of membership, however at this time they have not done so.

Associate members MAY be given proxy to vote when a Regular Member is not present at a call for a vote, but under NO circumstance shall their be more than ONE vote per represented cabin permit, and that cabin MUST have an owner holding Regular Membership.

Having said all this, our membership is strengthened by a diversity of ideas. All interested cabin 'secondary owners' not recognized as such by the Forest Service as such, family and interested cabin users are encouraged to join as Associate members. All member involvement is what makes the MRFHA a viable organization with a voice to be heard.
